Eugene O'Neill: A Life in Four Acts, Robert Dowling, Yale University Press, 2014 Written by a local author and professor of English at CCSU. Dr. Dowling is also on the Board of the Eugene O'Neill Society, and a Eugene O'Neill expert, who lives right in NL.

O'Neill: Life with Monte Cristo, Arthur and Barbara Gelb, Applause Books, 2000 Great biography of O'Neill and his family. The Gelbs were well known theatre critics, writers and journalists. Arthur was a long-time fixture at the NY Times and its Managing Editor in the late 1980's.

O'Neill: Son and Playwright, Louis Schaeffer, Little Brown and Co., 1968. Volume I of very extensive biography of O'Neill's early life and early career. Good for info on his connections to New London. Available in paperback from Amazon, or can be ordered from local bookstores.

O'Neill: Son and Artist, Louis Schaeffer, Cooper Square Press, 2002. Volume II on Eugene O'Neill's life from 1920. Pulitzer Prize winner.

Eugene O'Neill and Dat Ole Davil Sea, Robert Richter, Mystic Seaport, 2004.

The relationship of O'Neill and the sea and its continual influence on his life and work. Rob is a Docent Academy presenter. He is Director of Arts Programming at Connecticut College and an O'Neill expert.
